The Role

The Registered Veterinary Technologist provides care directly related to the health of animals at the shelter. The position will provide exciting opportunities to work with alongside both internal and external members of the community while maintaining EHS mission, vision, and values.

Key Roles & Responsibilities

This position is responsible for a variety of functions as follows:

- Medicating, deworming, weighing, vaccinating, wound care, x-rays, fecal and urinalysis, in-house lab work, rounds and physical exam re-checks.
- Assist veterinarians in management of animals requiring advanced care (diagnostic work ups, implementing veterinary treatment plans, follow-up treatments, rechecks).
- Entry Examinations (health exam, vaccinate, enter results into computer) on all animals entering shelter.
- Foster animal exams, treatments, and follow-ups.
- Surgical preparation, monitoring anesthesia and post-op recovery.
- Adopter Education as required for adoptable animals requiring a higher level of care post adoption or has needs specific to a health concern or surgery performed
