MESSAGE FROM THE CEO

In 2015, the Edmonton Humane Society (EHS) underwent a transformation as we recrafted our mission and vision and formed three organizational pillars: EVOLVE, ENGAGE, and ENHANCE. Part of our evolution involved an expansion and diversification of programs and services, and process improvements in animal health and operations. We engaged new stakeholders, extended our reach, and moved further toward our vision of becoming a model of excellence in the advancement of animal welfare. I am pleased to present our 2015 Annual Report, which highlights the Society's many accomplishments over the past year.

EHS became the first shelter in Western Canada to commit to the Million Cat Challenge, a North America-wide initiative aimed at saving one million cat lives in five years. I am thrilled to say the Society meets all five Million Cat Challenge key program criteria. including our newly piloted Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR) program/ which is essential to addressing cat overpopulation and managing cat populations more effectively.

As a shelter that is open to all animals irrespective of condition. we can be faced with heart-wrenching animal cases; we are also fortunate to witness an abundance of inspiring stories, which we are privileged to share with you. We garnered worldwide media attention for our superstar Henry the Warrior Cat, who became an ambassador for our Sick & Injured Animal Fund, and helped us bolster our strong social media following in Edmonton and communities beyond.

I am extremely proud of the results achieved in 2015 and thank the EHS team - the employees and volunteers who work firelessly and passionately to meet our mission – they inspire me every day. And to our generous donors and supporters - I am forever indebted and grateful. We are committed to best practice changes. in animal welfare, and are grateful for the dedication of our Edmonton community as we work to enrich the lives of people and companion animals and to save animal lives.

SHELTER **OPERATIONS**

Many partners contribute to the success of the Edmonton Humane Society, and in 2015 we made a concerted effort to identify and establish new work relationships with new partners in animal welfare. We provided the service and communication necessary to build and maintain strong relationships with our partners; from the City of Edmonton and other municipalities to numerous rescue organizations, we continue to work with these groups, creating partnerships that help us meet organizational goals and work collaboratively to advance animal welfare initiatives.

To increase EHS' reach within the city and surrounding areas, we expanded shelter operations to satellite adoption centres at Petland and PetSmart stores to showcase adult cats in satellite locations. By expanding into retail locations, we are provided with additional space to feature adoptable animals, expanding our capacity to rehome more cats, and enhance our presence in the community.

EHS' volunteer department is foundational to shelter operations. In 2015, volunteers contributed nearly 48,000 hours to the Edmonton Humane Society. Volunteers support the shelter in many capacities, from animal socialization and interaction, to special events and fundraising. They also contribute their time to operational areas such as administrative services and animal health.

Our foster program, which relies on volunteer foster homes, provided loving care to 1337 animals in 2015, who benefited from the loving care of a home environment prior to adoption.

New volunteer positions introduced in 2015 were created to help enhance the volunteer experience and give people a greater breath of opportunities to contribute to the shelter and provide enrichment and support to the thousands of animals we care for each year.

The volunteer services department made many positive changes in 2015, improving access to volunteer opportunities and streamlining the volunteer orientation and training processes by migrating initial training to an online platform. We are lucky to have strong community support and ongoing keen interest in our volunteer program; to better respond to this demand, volunteer intake shifted to open admission, so that applications are accepted on an ongoing basis. Since opening the application process in October, over 1000 volunteer applications have been submitted. Our volunteers are an integral part of our team.

ANIMAL **HEALTH**

In 2015, EHS' animal health team continued to provide superior medical care for shelter animals and implement progressive practices to achieve positive animal outcomes. Committed to reducing pet overpopulation, the animal health team performed 4,405 spay/neuter surgeries throughout the year. In addition, new initiatives led to more animal lives saved than ever before.



The trap-neuter-return (TNR) program was piloted in 2015 to help manage and protect feral cat populations in our region. TNR makes it possible for the public to admit feral cats to the shelter; the EHS animal health team will spay/neuter and vaccinate these cats before returning them to field. This initiative represents a strong step forward in dealing with the problem of cat overpopulation and stray cat populations in our community. Implementing TNR was the final criteria required for EHS to meet all five Million Cat Challenge program criteria - a North America-wide initiative aiming at saving one million cat lives in five years. In 2015, TNR saved the lives of 74 feral cats by sterilizing them and returning them to field, where they will live their lives without further contributing to the societal issue of cat overpopulation.

As a learning facility, EHS' animal health division mentored students in veterinary and shelter medicine throughout 2015, including hosting international veterinarians. In addition, specialized medical cases throughout the year were supported through the use of solid community partnerships, allowing us to maintain the highest level of care for our animals.

BEHAVIOUR

The EHS behaviour team continues to demonstrate leadership in the advancement of positive behaviour training methods. Our behaviour modification experts are always looking for innovative ways to work with shelter animals, rehabilitate animals with behaviour issues, and set animals up for success in their forever homes.

In 2015, the behaviour department introduced the Farm Friends program as an alternative for dogs who do not thrive as indoor pets. The Adoption Ambassador program was started to allow dogs who do not fare well in a shelter environment to be placed in a home so we can truly assess their personalities and build their profiles. This program also gives foster parents an active role in helping to adopt their foster dog.

Our behaviour team works with our rescue partners to provide further options for animals who do not thrive in a shelter environment. We continue to enjoy a close collaborative relationship with our campus partner, the City of Edmonton's Animal Care & Control Centre (ACCC); we work together to provide premium care for homeless, abused, and neglected animals in the Edmonton region in areas such as behaviour rehabilitation and animal socialization.

Pet Photography and Cat Yoga were among the new offerings generating awesome community response, driving further innovation.

The Canine Enrichment Centre continues to offer world-class training, both in group and private settings. In 2015, EHS trainers obtained Certified Professional Dog Trainer-Knowledge Assessed (CPDT-KA) designations, which strengthened our expertise and added to our reputation as one of the best dog training facilities in the city.

Appealing new classes, like Drop-in Agility, have become more popular and exposed the shelter to new audiences. Central Bark's offleash park membership is the highest it has ever been, thanks to positive, customer-focused changes that have improved the park experience for members. The CEC's dog daycare continues to offer premiere dog care to over 200 clients who entrust their beloved pets to EHS professionals.














FUND DEVELOPMENT

2015 was another record-breaking year for fund development, with the most successful Paws & Claws Gala, Pet Pics with Santa, and Pets in the Park ever, giving EHS greater opportunities for community engagement and bringing in crucial revenue to support shelter animals.

The 7th annual Paws & Claws Gala, presented by Coventry Homes, continues to be a key event for EHS and we are grateful to Henri Rodier and the Coventry team for their ongoing support. We are also indebted to Len Rhodes, President and CEO of the Edmonton Eskimos Football Club, who is a champion for EHS and all its initiatives, most notably as Grand Marshal and leading fundraiser for Pets in the Park.

This year also saw the launch of EHS' Give Hope initiative – an online fundraising platform that uses individual animal cases, powerful images, and social sharing in a way that gives people an opportunity to contribute directly to the life-saving work we do at the shelter. Backed by beloved Canadian singer/ songwriter Jann Arden, the Give Hope campaign marks a new direction in fundraising for the EHS and has already proved successful: launched in early November, the platform has generated funds devoted to specialized surgeries and treatments within our Sick & Injured Animal Fund.

Our successes are rightfully shared with the community, and we are grateful for the steadfast support of EHS advocates. From our major corporate sponsors to individuals, families, and local businesses, we thank you.




COMMUNICATIONS

In 2015, our communications team continued to bring to life and share the Edmonton Humane Society's important stories. Among those, one notable story is that of Henry the Warrior Cat. Henry captured the hearts of fans around the world with his tale of hope and resilience. The broken kitten found at the side of a highway had an especially sweet storybook ending when the family that found him, returned to adopt him. Henry served as a wonderful ambassador for shelter animals, and kick-started the use of online crowdsourcing as a viable source of funding for EHS animals; Henry's case would later inspire EHS' new Give Hope campaign.

The EHS also found itself in the spotlight when famous UK pop artist Ed Sheeran happened to drop in on an EHS fundraising event - and sing a few bars with a local music student! Media outlets from around the world shared Mr. Sheeran's drop-in surprise visit with audiences everywhere, and brought attention to the positive work the Society does each day.



Accordingly, our verification of these revenues was limited to the amount recorded in the records of the Society and we were not able to determine whether any adjustments might be necessary to contributions, deficiency of revenue over expenses, current assets and net assets.
